Synopsis

Revisiting the path of Hebraic, Christian and Muslim beliefs, this essay deals with the complex mechanisms that made each of these initially progress minded societal survival tools gradually drift into rigid certitudes guardians of self-proclaimed eternal truths.

Scrutinizing each of the main monotheist beliefs, analyzing the weight of external influence and politics as well as the limits of historical evidence in many of the claimed divine events, the authors identifies recurrent and similar drifting mechanisms in each of the three "revealed" religions. In addition to generally hyper-inflated inventories of imaginative dogmas and rituals of another age – not always fully in line with the reference initial revelation content or spirit – the most striking similarity emerging out of monotheist institutions is the difficulty to adjust to human knowledge evolution. Instead, facing the chaos of ignorance, monotheist enterprises prefer to hide common sense ambiguities through sacred untouchable dogmas. These institutionalized codes of belief hinder monotheist creeds to play their therapeutic missions in assisting today's secular globalized world in a peaceful adjustment of governance principles so to meet the challenges resulting from 21st century new realities. Only a tolerant and educated split between spiritual beliefs and secular knowledge will be able to guide monotheist thoughts out of the profound human impasses they have drifted in.
